Education is the basic need for the all round development of a society but I believe that we should work to eradicate moral degradation and corruption from the society which can create a new dimension of life.

Different kinds of developmental activities were undertaken during the last financial year 2010-2011 but we have to do more work to reduce hunger, food insecurity, forced migration, poor health & education and off course resource management specially local-natural & human resource etc.

Secretary's Report

I am glad to present you the annual report of Technology Resource Communication & Service Centre (TRCSC) for the financial year 2010-11.

This year, a number of developmental activities were undertaken related to food and livelihood security for small and marginal families for their sustenance. However, due to the drought situation in the area, most of the agriculture-horticultural activities were affected and majority of the farming families facing the acute problem to arrange their staple food. TRCSC intervene in the area to promote dry land agriculture and alternative agricultural activities for coping up the situation.

We have promoted SRI directly in our intervened areas and through partners organization in other areas, but desired goal not to be achieved due to severe drought situation.

Among other projects one may note i) Horticulture development in 3 blocks of Saraikella-Kharsanwa district of Jharkhand ii) Up land rice promotion in patamda block iii) Shiksha Se Parivartan in Ichagorh block iv) People empowerment for right to livelihood(PEARL) in 14 villages of Ichagorh block v) Pre-election voters awareness campaign(PEVAC) in 56 villages of 3 blocks of Saraikella-Kharsanwa district of Jharkhand. A significant number of schemes were linked to the villagers as a drought response strategy.

After a long gap of 32 years, the panchayat election was held in Jharkhand, TRCSC actively participated in the PEVAC for sensitization to the voters for their rights and duties in PRI System, and its result was quite exhilarating.

We had closely associated with the Government departments on various work at block, district, state and national level for the benefit of poor and marginalize families.

Overall, the programme and projects are being designed and initiated with a wider scope to take on board not only immediate livelihood concerns but also ecological sustainability issues.

I pay my sincere gratitude and thanks to our Board of Trustees and Managing Committee Members, Advisors, Resource providers, partners and well wishers for providing us their valuable assistance and support. I am sure with their continued support we would be able to address the concerns of social development. Last but not the least; I would like to thank each and every members of TRCSC family without whose support we could not have made any progress towards achieving of our goal.

Provide value based quality services and facilitate optimum development through a practical approach and participatory learning processes to empower communities.



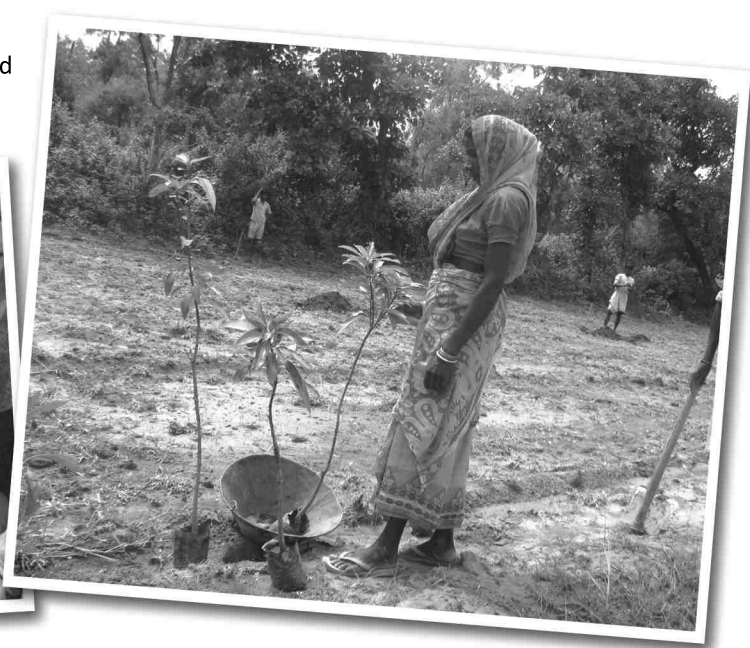
Objectives

TRCSC is both as an intermediary and implementing agency and the main objectives of our activities are

- To reduce hunger, malnutrition & poverty and promote sustainable livelihoods through information dissemination, skill development, action research and creation/strengthening of community based organizations.
- To generate new employment opportunities through individual or group based micro-enterprises, particularly in the field of processing agriculture, animal husbandry, fisheries and tree based produce etc. and production of small tools & bio-inputs.
- To reduce illiteracy or mobilize/provide both formal and non-formal education, training & apprenticeship opportunities for children & adolescents.
- To raise awareness about the problems of community health, environmental degradation and support group or community based initiatives to address such issues.
- To enhance capacity of CBOs, CSOs particularly in the field of community based resource mapping and enhance co-operation among various CBOs, PRIs and State level institutions so that basic rights are ensured and access barriers are reduced.

Approach

- TRCSC shall promote and support group and community based & community managed organizations that are based on principles of mutual cooperation and basic self-sufficiency.
- TRCSC shall focus on the development of both technical as well as social skills that are needed to improve the quality of life and bring real & lasting changes that transform rural communities.

Improving Food & Nutritional Security

Despite impressive economic growth of the country in the recent years, a significant number of families from remote village, still facing the problems of food insecurity. The level of food absorption is also low. A large number of children below the age of 5 are under weight; around half of pregnant women are anemic. An attempt has been made to improve food insecurity and nutritional status of such families from our intervention area. By introducing SRI/SWI in the field we are able to reduce distressed period of poor families. In spite of erratic rain fall, result of SRI/SWI is quite satisfactory. In this system consumption of less water and low investment and return almost double yield, are being widely accepted by the farmers of our intervention area. Promotion of SRI/SWI was done by the organization and along with the partners in their respective areas. A series of trainings on SRI/SWI was conducted and awareness created through wall writing, video show, distributing pamphlet and exposures visit. More than 600 farmers adopted this method. Similarly to improve nutritional status of children and women, nutritional garden were developed in the backyard of 262 families of Bandu, Gorangkocha and Gudri Panchayats of Ichagarh Block. Promotation of upland rice varieties cultivated by 4676 farmers in their uplands of Patamda and Ichagorh blocks.

Employment Generation & Micro Enterprise Development

Looking at the poverty, unemployment and labour market scenario, it is very difficult to engage the existing million unemployed work force along with large number of casual labours who have no regular source of work or income. Formation and strengthening of Self Help Groups and linkages for credit with financial institutions is one of the steps in this regard. Till now we have 63 SHGs, almost all Groups were linked with nearest banks. Out of 63 groups 28 group received loan for different income generation activities. Six farmers were given loan under KCC.

Livelihood Security & Employment Generation

Livelihood insecurity is the major challenge in today's scenario. A large number of poor and unemployed are not able to secure their livelihood and it affect the economy of the nation. To neutralize this problem, TRCSC gave emphasis of plantation of fruit bearing plants like cashew, mango, etc in an orchard form at upland and barren land under National Horticulture Mission. During this year Cashew and Mango plants were planted in 600 and 100 hectares of land . Since last 2 years people of this area are facing the acute problems of drought, hence some of the activities were implemented as a drought response such as pulse seed, oil seed and vegetable seed are distributed with the support of horticulture mission. Under such schemes, 102 farmers done commercial vegetable cultivation, 72 farmers were supported for Pulse and Oilseed cultivation. A number of trainings and exposures for the farmers were done by the TRCSC and ATMA. A group of 25 farmers started Sidhu Kanhu Pathshala and doing commercial floriculture.



Education and Training

Education & Training is a catalyst and change agent towards the socio economic development of individual. For improvement of quality and quantitative education in the target area, a project namely Shiksha se Parivartan (Change through education) has been running since October 2011 in three panchayats of Ichagarh block of Kharsanwa district. To fulfill the project objectives the VEC, PTA-MTA, Balsansad, Bal club etc have been strengthened through different trainings, meetings exposures etc. Children of 15 and above age group from poor families provided different vocational trainings to ensure their livelihood. Some of the poor and talented students who are studying technical course they are conferred with one time scholarship under IGSSS Project. This fellowship helps them to continue their study without economic hardship.



Health, Water and Sanitation

Health is an important asset for economic development of any nation. But, the accessibility of Health, Water, Sanitation facility is not adequate in people and they are gradually lagging from main stream of development. Our intervention area are covered with small and medium industries, mines and crusher machines. Health hazard is the prime concern of this area. Owing to opening of a large number of industries, population of immigrant have been increasing day by day. So it is felt need to aware the people about HIV/AIDS. A workshop was organized on HIV/AIDS to make people awareness. Prof. Matin A. Khan was the resource person of the workshop.

Capacity Building of CBOs and CSOs

Community Based Organization and Civil Society Organization is the most important catalyst in the process of development. So, it is necessary to capacitate CBOs and CSOs to connect people with main stream of development. A number of CBOs, namely SHG, Kisan clubs, Youth clubs, Bal club, Water user group, were formed and their capacity building was done. A number of training was conducted to capacitate them. Regular discussion with other CSOs working in the areas and networking for common issues for development.

PRI and Gram Sabha is the lower strata but strongest beam of democracy. After a long gap 1978, Panchayat Election has been conducted in Jharkahnd in five phases. It was felt need to sensitize CBOs, village level workers, NGO workers about New Panchayati Raj System, so that mis-conception regarding PRI may clarify. PEVAC was done intensively in field and its result was also quite satisfactory. *Elected members of PRI were oriented and capacitated regarding their role and responsibilities.*



Research and Training

Hunger Mapping

CWS, Jharkhand with the help of other partner's organisation conducted a study on the issue, status of the hunger dynamics of state with people's perspective in 75 villages and 12 municipal slums of 6 different climatic zones of Jharkhand with 1634 sample. TRCSC was one of the partner who was actively evolved in the study from very beginning.

Main objective of the study were as follow.

- To identify vulnerable groups.
- To identify seasonality food insecurity pattern among them.
- To identify access to own resources and state entitlement.
- To identify absorption in terms of access of safe drinking water and sanitation

To fulfill the above study, TRCSC conducted intensive survey and analysis in 11 villages from Chandil and Ichagrah blocks of Sraikela-kharsanwa district and one urban area of Jamshedpur , where 550 formats were filled , data were collected and analyzed, and final data and findings were sent to CWS for wider and depth analysis.

Conservation Plan

Technology Resource Communication & Service Center (TRCSC), a CSO in the area, one of the ECO-TASK Force members has been given the responsibility for the study and preparation of the wildlife conservation plan for Tata Steel in consultation with the villagers, experts, CSOs in the areas and various Govt. departments particularly forest department.

The plan has been prepared for a period of 5 years and includes prescription to mitigate the factors contributing depletion of flora and fauna with the help of local

people, forest protection committees, civil society organizations, forest department and its supplementary departments.

DPR for Watershed

TRCSC in collaboration with SHAPE, Kolkata was developed and prepared the ten watersheds detail project report (DPR) at Garanala area of block Rajnagar of Saraikella Kharsanwa district of Jharkhand for implementation of the plan for sustainable livelihood of the area.
